## Chapter One

# THREE WORDS FROM THE CHURCH

What I am so gracious for from the Lord, is His unfailing love towards the Church, that wherever Christ is preached, hope is placed in the hearts of men and women everywhere. I am also grateful of the consistent words of knowledge and prophetic words which come through the Church. I would like to take this time to talk about three major messages that have been prevalent in the Church over the past few years.

## 1. "This Generation."

At the time of my salvation, there was a recognition that God was going to move among this generation like He has never moved before. Now how true this may be, I do not know, but I do believe that the Lord is moving in a way that the United States of America has never seen. This generation is the most lost and polluted generation since the time of Christ Himself, and it is because of this lawlessness and sinfulness that the Lord can save with a mighty hand. The word that came forth was along the following, "This generation is going to blow right by our generation in serving the Lord." It is true that this generation is "breaking-the-ice". God has called young men and women who are throwing off, first, the chains of religion, and secondly, after this is done, the bondage of false and deceitful teachings.

Men and women, who are getting

saved, are realizing how slow and bogged down the Church is. They realize they have one to seven persons in the Church who do everything and that this will not work. They have also heard these leaders in the Church preach about this “new move” of God and understand that they are a part of this prophesied generation. They recognize the true burden that comes with this responsibility, not the man-made, devil-infested burden that chokes and smothers so bad that when a breath of fresh air comes, we call it a REVIVAL! No, this generation understands that revival is not an event that bursts into flames and then dies, but an everlasting change in which the Lord births in us the power to “trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall any means hurt” us!

This generation has tasted the coming refreshing and understands the cost. However, it is a shame that most of the heart wrenching persecution will

come from those whom the Lord has used to prophesy this blessed event.

## 2. "Think outside-of-the-box."

I tell you the truth; I was excited to hear this sermon. Honestly, it filled me with great eagerness to know what the Lord was going to do. I think the whole congregation was ecstatic at what the next step would be! But may I ask you a question? Were you ever told exactly what "out-of-the-box" thinking meant? Probably not. But if you made any attempt, chances are you were rebuked. If you weren't rebuked, chances are you are on the Church staff right now and you truly never thought "out-of-the-box". Oh, you were charismatic, energetic and appealing (I know, I was there also), but remember Christ!

*"He had no form or comeliness, and when we see Him, there is no beauty that we should desire Him." (Isaiah 53:2, NKJV)*

I can almost guarantee that there was a form of “out-of-the-box” preaching during the time of Christ also. There were Priests who tried to motivate their nation and Governors who tried to appease their constituents. But this type of preaching is not “out-of-the-box” thinking, its only purpose is to fill the box. It came from the box, and it is for the box.

The Lord has dealt with me on this. “Out-of-the-box” thinking while remaining “in-the-box” is called... *Imagination*. What we are really preaching is this:

*Imagine God saving!*  
*Imagine God moving!*  
*Imagine the Lord pouring out*  
*His Spirit like on Pentecost!*  
*Imagine!*

Do you know what imagination is? It is Christ without power. Brothers and sisters, we might as well join the YMCA,

sit with our legs crossed, hands in the air, eyes closed and IMAGINE a peaceful place. God help us! Jesus forgive us! Jesus, forgive me!

If you are a preacher and you are preaching, “think out-of-the-box”, jump out of it yourself, O man of faith! Don’t just quote Paul, live Paul. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, not just the doctrines of men. Don’t burden your brothers and sisters with your insecurities and call it “edifying the flock”. No, live by example and no one will be able to stop your brothers and sisters from living for Christ. If your most exciting service is the new Church building meeting, then you’re not thinking “out-of-the-box”, you have just found a way to make the box bigger.

3. "God is not going to do Church the way we've been doing Church."

This is perhaps the most amazing prophesy I am hearing from the Church. To me, it seems to be the end of an era. You don't know how many times I have heard preachers say that God will honor their system of doing things. I often wondered when God will get tired of honoring such foolish thoughts. Was it that the Lord honored your system, or He just moved when someone humbled themselves and He found faith? Think about it. And even if God is honoring your system, it is to win you to trust Him and begin to honor Christ completely.

I say this as a warning. This is not a word of the Lord through me. This is through your own peers. If God Almighty is not going to do things the way He use to, it sounds like the time for honoring such systems and such ways of

thinking have come near to a close. Now, don't get me wrong, God will continue to use what little bit of Christ we offer Him, but how much more will He use a **"Generation"** who is **"out-of-the-box"** and not willing to do it the **"same old way"**? Oh, it is coming my dear brothers and sisters; actually, it has already begun. Prepare yourselves.



## Chapter Two

# BE LIKE CHRIST

Now young prophets, the Lord is going to use you, no doubts about that. But the only way you will remain humble is to remember our living Lord, His precious words, and His ultimate sacrifice. The Lord warns us, by His Spirit, that we become easily puffed-up when we are used to proclaim His words, especially His specific, divine, made-for-the-moment words. Yet, if we would live our lives by His eternal, God-fearing, all-powerful and timeless teachings - the balance we long for will always be intact.

Our brother Paul tells us to let the

“word of Christ dwell in us richly”<sup>1</sup>. Why did he say that? Why did he rebuke the Corinthians, our very own brothers and sisters in the Lord, by saying “Now I say this, that each of you says, ‘I am of Paul’, or ‘I am of Apollos’, or ‘I am of Cephas’, or ‘I am of Christ’. Is Christ divided?”<sup>2</sup> Do you think he knew something we have forgotten? Jesus, our truth giving Savior, said:

*“If anyone loves me, he will keep my word; and my Father will love him and we will come to him and make our abode with him. He who does not love Me, does not keep my words, and the word which you hear is not Mine, but the Father’s who sent Me.” (John 14:23-24, NKJV)*

So, to fulfill your calling, I admonish you to weep over the words of Christ.

Remember to lend, hoping for nothing in return. When you are cursed, bless. When those you love say all kinds of evil about you for following Christ with a pure heart, rejoice! Give, because it has been freely given. Fast. Pray. Forgive. And most importantly, hold dear to the words of Jesus when He said:

*“So you too, when you do all the things which are commanded you, say, ‘We are unworthy slaves; we have done only that which we ought to have done.’” (Luke 17:10 NASB)*

You must remember that your reward is in heaven. Do not be blinded by greed. If you are in dire need and able to work, work. Pay what you must pay. Be an example to those who are being saved by Christ Himself. If the Lord permits you to preach and teach without working, then do so with your whole heart. But remember, with God, things happen in seasons. Just because you are

a full-time prophet, don't be a full-time burden. It is not your brothers and sisters responsibility to support you - it is God's and His ways are mysterious. Do not idolize those who year after year only "minister to the Lord". Their calling is no greater than yours. I hope by now, you will see that God uses the foolish things of the world to confound the wise.

Do not set your hearts on earthly rewards. If God wants to bless you in this manner, He will, and you won't have to convince anyone else of His blessing on you. Money comes. Money goes. But faith, love and hope in our Lord will remain forever. Do not belittle yourself if you do not have a Church. Do not think less of yourself if you are not even part of a Church staff. You're not an ordained pastor? Don't worry, neither was Christ. If money and success is all you long for, then that will be all you have to offer others, and you will never have enough money or success to share with everyone. Yet faith, love, hope, gentleness, self-control, and all the fruits

of the Spirit can be shared with all, because you have an infinite supply. But if you choose money, success, and praise from others, you will eventually fall from Christ's teachings and be deceived. Remember what our brother John wrote in 2 John:

*"For many deceivers have gone out into the world, those who do not acknowledge Jesus Christ as coming in flesh. This is the deceiver and the anti-christ. Watch yourselves that you do not lose what we have accomplished, but that you may receive a full reward. Anyone who goes too far and does not abide in the teaching of Christ, does not have God, the one who abides in the teaching of Christ, he has both the Father and the Son." (2 John 7-9 NASB)*

It is the words of Christ that will keep you from the whims of the devil and the vanity of man.

Next, pray. Do not be afraid to pray. Storm heaven! Yell at the sky! Pound the ground! Jump! Scream! Dance! Cry! Do whatever you have to do when you're in your closet of prayer. However, when praying with others, don't scare Jesus out of them! Be genuine. If you pray fearlessly alone, you will pray powerfully with others. With your whole heart, approach the living and unchangeable God who knows all of your selfish motives, sins, adulteries of the eyes, and envies of the flesh. Seek after God, cry out and ask, knock until it is opened, and when the Spirit of truth falls on you, you will be broken. If it doesn't fall, pray until you're broken so it will fall. Jesus will not let you down.

Fast, also. Fasting will humble you. It will make you see that you cannot make it on your own. Remember, even Christ needed angels to tend Him after His fast. If the Son of God needed assistance on this earth, so will you and fasting can teach you this.

Lastly, forgive. If any resemblance of

Christ is upon you, you have already been persecuted. You have been crushed, but it is the Lord's will to crush you. It pleases Him. Remember Isaiah 53? He is teaching you forgiveness. It was a tough lesson for me to learn and I must continually relearn it, but in forgiveness - all the power of the devil is destroyed. Yes! All the power of the devil is destroyed in forgiveness! That is why satan works so hard to harden your hearts. But you, young prophets, must rise above this attack. Persevere and attain your crown. Be like a child and humble yourself.

These are all teachings of Christ. Pour your heart over the four gospels - over Christ's life-giving words. They are so powerful. So, life changing! When you came to Christ, did you read Job or John? You read about the Messiah! You were overwhelmed. You thought, "Did Jesus actually say that?" Then you became so excited, you had to find out about the end. So, you read the Revelation and even more of the fear of the Lord entered

your heart! Oh, the fear of the Lord is glorious to His saints! Don't let anyone belittle that fact. Look at the example Jesus set. You wonder what Jesus was like? What is written in Isaiah 11?

*There shall come forth a Rod from the stem of Jesse, and a Branch shall grow out of his roots.*

*The Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon Him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord.*

***His delight is in the fear of the Lord,** and He shall not judge by the sight of His eyes, nor decide by the hearing of His ears;*

*But with righteousness He shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; He shall strike the earth with the rod of His mouth, and with the breath of His lips He shall slay the wicked.*

*Righteousness shall be the belt of His  
loins, and faithfulness the belt of  
His waist.*

His delight is in the fear of the Lord!  
How much more will His delight be in  
those who fear the Lord?

Oh, let this picture of Christ sink into  
your heart and beg the Lord, with great  
thanksgiving, that you will be just like  
this. Oh, that the righteousness of Christ  
would fill our hearts! Don't wait for an  
altar call. You are the altar and in you is  
the sacrificed and risen Son of God. All-  
powerful and dwelling in you. All-  
forgiving and abiding in you. All-loving  
and living in you! Or does He?

Too long the wisdom of the Church  
has conflicted with the wisdom of Christ.  
Men and women are too worried about  
building an empire instead of building a  
kingdom. Let us be different. Let us not  
be confined to the traditions of men, but  
be compelled by the words of Jesus. For  
then we shall know the truth and the

truth will set us free.

## Chapter Three

# GODLY EXAMPLES

The Greatest Prophet of All Time...

*“What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind? But what did you go out to see? A man clothed in soft garments? Indeed those who are gorgeously appareled and live in luxury are in king’s courts. But what did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I say to you, and more than a prophet. This is he of whom it is written: ‘Behold, I send My messenger before Your face, Who will prepare Your way before You.’ For I say to you, among those born of*

*women there is not a greater prophet than John the Baptist; but he who is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he." (Luke 7:24-28, NKJV)*

How would you like the Lord Jesus Christ to compliment you in such a manner? The living Son of God bragging about you! Surely this is a foreshadowing of the judgment day, is it not? So, here he is! The greatest prophet of all time: John the Baptist. And not only a prophet, but an evangelist, preacher, teacher and pastor! Never thought of our brother John that way? Well, he was all these things. John the Baptist was a prophet before the Lord, a shepherd among his disciples, a preacher of the good news and an evangelist to those who came from miles and miles to hear him. He was the chosen one of the Lord to make straight His paths, and now, we are the chosen ones of the Lord to make straight His paths and to prepare the way for His second coming.

Let us look at what the Lord said about John. *“What did you go out into the wilderness to see?”* How about I rephrase the question like this, *“What did you go to Church to see?”* Was it the best contemporary worship team in a thirty mile radius? Or did you have the wittiest and most handsome pastor around? I know! You come to see the nicest state-of-the-art sanctuary in your town! Oh my, how computers make worship so easy! How about this question: Why did you come to Christ? I hope and pray it wasn't because the pastor of the Church had a nice car and you want one too. I hope it is not for your greed that you worship the Living God. So, why did you come to Christ?

I came to Christ when a family member of mine turned their back on the lusts of this world and decided to take up their cross for Christ. I thought they were crazy at first, but I was so intrigued why anyone would want to consider this world as worthless, and give up everything for religion, and even want

me to join in the party! They would invite me to Church and I would decline, yet something captivated me. I would visit this family member, and do you know what I expected to see? To be honest, I expected to see a “reed shaken by the wind”. The general consensus of the family is that this religious experience would not last. The wind would eventually blow too hard, and the reed would be broken. But there was something more powerful than religion working here. It was Jesus Christ.

Isn't your salvation strengthened by the fortitude of others? The unwavering faith of the saints? When this entire world is gone, all your money, your valuables, your friends - will you still have Christ? If you can answer “Yes”, then you too will not be blotted out of Lord's book of life. I also understand that you have been hurt by those whose faith is so shallow. Those who boasted on standing on the Rock yet were merely reeds in the desert, but Jesus loves them too. He is refining us all. Remember, we

still must forgive. Praise the Lord!

The next fascinating question is this: *“But what did you go out to see? A man clothed in soft garments?”* This is perhaps where the Church and Christ conflict the most in the entire world, not just the United States. Even in our own minds, we must continually guard against this temptation. Do we think less of those who are not dressed well when they preach? If you don't have a suit and a tie, you can't be preaching God's holy word! Or are you the other extreme. “Our pastor wears T-shirts, or he always has his top three buttons undone while he preaches. He is so laid back! We've been thinking about replacing the sanctuary floor with sand and planting palms!” In both cases, whether sophisticated or casual, elegant or plain, the goal is to look the best. Don't be fooled just because there is such a mixture of standards in the world. No matter how you judge by the flesh, it is still the flesh. A humble man can wear a suit, but he does not lust after it. A humble man can

preach in a T-shirt, it's because that is what he owns. But what does the Lord say about such men who are clothed in "soft garments"? He says, "*Indeed those who are gorgeously appareled and live in luxury are in king's courts.*" Jesus compares them to the world.

The devil will continually tempt you to be like the world. To give in, so you will be accepted by all and praised by all. But the Lord said, "Woe to you when all men speak well of you, for so they did to the false prophets also."<sup>3</sup> Now I am not saying you should have the mentality of, 'If they're not stoning me, I must not be preaching the gospel.' Or the other thinking of, 'If I'm not yelling at them, they won't listen.' When the Lord spoke of John the Baptist and said, "*Indeed those who are gorgeously appareled and live in luxury are in king's courts,*" He wanted us to understand that our reward is in heaven. I am sorry, but if you are

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preaching God's prosperity and using the Law as your reference, your reference material is out-dated.

Have you never read that we are under a "new" covenant? The old is washed away by the blood. There is no more Law at work in a believer. Its purpose was to serve as a tutor to bring us to Christ (Galatians 3). True the Law is still at work in the world, but we are held captive by the Son of God and all of His freedom. Freedom to live, but not freedom to sin. Freedom to pursue truth, but not freedom to abuse the graces of God. Freedom to do all the Lord has called us to do, but not freedom to abandon contentment and decency. Freedom to fearlessly proclaim the good news, but not freedom to flaunt our flesh and dress our pride. Freedom to love and submit to one another, but not freedom to lord and control those who we claim to love. Freedom to forgive everyone, yes, everyone, but not freedom to trample on people for the sake of our ministries. Where the Spirit of the Lord is

there is freedom, but our freedom is for His glory, not ours.

So I ask, "*But what did you go out to see?*" Was it "*a prophet?*" Was it "*a preacher?*" Was it "*an evangelist?*" I imagine it was even more than any of these! Even the Lord said of John, "*Yes, I say to you, and more than a prophet.*" Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is always a "more than". What I mean is this: It wasn't that a man was just preaching good news, it was "more than" that. Do you remember what our Lord said in Mark's gospel? "And they went out and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word through the accompanying signs. Amen." You see, there was a "more than" at work here. Do you think our brother John could have foreseen the multitudes coming to him? Do you think he understood that because of his preaching and shepherding, he was already teaching the twelve apostles what the Christ was like? There is always so much "more than" we can

comprehend when we preach Christ, but we must preach **Christ!** Unfortunately for the Church, the “more than” has become a show, the sermon, prosperity, pride, our “separation” from the world, and yet Christ’s “more than” goes beyond earthly measure. Did you get saved because of the song selection? No, it was more than that! Did you receive the Holy Spirit during a witty joke in the sermon? No, it was more than that! Did you fall to your face because someone pointed a finger at you? No, it was **more than** that! Have you never read that it is the Spirit that convicts the world of sin? Have you never heard it is the Spirit that gives life? Have you forgotten that Jesus’ words are Spirit and Life? There is so much “more than” waiting for you, and not only waiting for you, but waiting for you to do!

John the Baptist’s example and Christ example are here for us to follow. Written plainly and simply stated. The good news is not for your mind to comprehend, but for your heart to

follow. Now young prophets and older prophets, I must reiterate: Beware of pride. Look at the ending of what Jesus said, *“For I say to you, among those born of women there is not a greater prophet than John the Baptist; but he who is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he.”* Think not too highly of yourself. Always take the lower seat, and let the Living Savior exalt you. It will be a constant attack from your enemy, but remember, he is your enemy. There is a reason why the devil brings forth the spirit of the anti-christ, because he is against everything Jesus taught. EVERYTHING! Please be careful. I have seen dear friends give in to this temptation. It is so subtle. At times, I fall. I hate pride and yet it wages war against me. We must die daily. We must be raised with Jesus. It will be tough and I do confess that all those who desire to follow the Lord’s calling and live a godly life will face persecution, but your reward is unspeakable!

## Chapter Four

# GOD IS NOT REPUBLICAN

Don't worry, He's not Democrat either. Let it settle into your heart - the Lord shows favoritism to no man. I repeat, no man. He is not concerned if a Democrat or if a Republican is in office. God does not dwell more in Texas than He does in Massachusetts, my dear fellow prophets. You must learn to clear your mind. Take such hindering thoughts captive by the power of Christ in you. Think upon that which is good and pure. The concerns of this world will blind you to the will of God, not only in your life, but even for the country which

you dwell.

I remember sitting at a table with friends after September 11<sup>th</sup>. They talked about the previous election and the war in Iraq, and to my amazement, this statement was made, *“God sure knew what He was doing this past election.”* The general line of thinking would be that God was making mistakes the previous presidential term and now was getting it right. You see my brothers and sisters; this is a dangerous way of thinking. We must remember that the Lord’s ways are not ours. Everything we are witnessing in the world is preparing the way for two crucial events:

1. The coming of the anti-christ.
2. The coming of the Lord.

We will not have one without the other. Greed, lust, thievery, drunkenness, hatred, all these things will increase. There will be a great falling away. Even beloved brothers and sisters

in the faith will give in to the flesh. The righteous chasing after pleasures? The faithful doubting His resurrection? The brave fearing death? All these things are coming and it is the devil's desire to keep you distracted. To make you angry at a political party for the way they voted. To make you hate an entire nation for the way they believe. To make you condemn men, that way you will be condemned. God does not care if you are a citizen of America any more than if you were a citizen of Zimbabwe. What He does desire is that you are a citizen of Heaven and that your conversation would be there also. We must speak of heavenly things. Blessing those who persecute us and praying for those who spitefully use us. Hallelujah! Remember, Christ did not overthrow the Roman Empire, He did even more than that, He destroyed ALL the works of the devil!

O Chosen Ones of the Lord, just because I have encouraged you not to become passionately involved in the affairs of this world, it does not mean

Jesus has turned a deaf ear nor covered His eyes to what is going on around us. It is for this purpose you have been called, to proclaim the words of Christ, first to the Church and secondly to the world. There is coming a swift rebuke for the Church in the United States and we must learn to accept it. For rejecting it would be rejecting Him who is sending the rebuke. Then the warnings to the world will begin. There will be specific warnings for towns and cities, and you will be the watchmen. Whether you live in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania or Sophia, North Carolina, the Lord will send His messengers. This is nothing new brothers and sisters. The Lord has been admonishing people from the beginning of time, through His earthly ministry, to Pentecost, and up to now. He will not stop until all is fulfilled and you are part of the fulfillment.

I know at times you feel overwhelmed, but I beg you to only fear Him who after He has killed you, has the power to throw you into hell. Please

understand this, I am not a *super-prophet*. I am a man just like you, made of flesh. I have fears and failures. I cannot count how many times I have cried to the Lord to forgive me for making excuses and trying to find a way out of His calling for me. But I am here for this purpose, to let you know you are not alone. And as the fire kindles across this nation, and the news starts to spread of how the Lord is moving, then I will be edified with you and we will become more like Jesus. I know it's in your heart to please the Lord. I know your heart breaks to be called "faithful". It is because of your heart that you have gone through what you have gone through. You have a broken heart and it must remain that way. The affairs of this world, including politics, harden your heart. Be aware of such things. Be an example for others to follow, so even if they deny Christ, they cannot deny your good works.

Do you remember when the devil tempted the Lord? He took Jesus and showed Him all the kingdoms of the

world, and do you remember what he said? The devil told our Lord, "All this authority I will give You, and their glory; for this has been delivered to me, and I give it to whomever I wish. Therefore, if You will worship before me, all will be Yours."<sup>4</sup> Now, for the sake of satan always using the Lord's words against us, I will use his words against him. Notice the temptation? All satan can offer is the glory of the flesh. He himself plainly states it. That's all he can work in. No eternal promises. No eternal hope. Only a passing pleasure. We must also remember that the Lord called him the "father of lies" and when he is speaking, he speaks his native tongue. So, we must also understand that what he said was a lie. Imagine telling the Son of God that you have the power to give a kingdom to "whomever I wish"! Oh, it is true that devil is at work in the kingdoms of the

world, but he would have no power at all unless it was given from above. As for kings and rulers, they are there because of God, not satan, and God has placed them there for a purpose. Unfortunately, men can become corrupted, but the end of all things is God's and He will do what He seems fit.

What I am getting at is this - the last thing the devil says is "if You will worship before me, all will be Yours." This is where we must be careful in where we place our passions. Politics, and even religion, will always start out by what they can offer you, but there is a cost. If you have been hurt by the Church, you have already seen the fruit of this temptation, "Submit before us and all of God's blessings will be yours!" Well, the same is of politics. You can be a wonderful follower of Christ, and the political party can be for good morals, but there will come a time when you will have to bow to that party for a "greater good". "Bow to this sin, and all this will be yours." That's true! You get the whole

mess! But what did Christ say? “GET BEHIND ME SATAN! For it is written, *“You shall worship the Lord your God, and Him only you shall serve!”*<sup>5</sup> When men or angels require this of you, it is the devil at work. Whether in the political arena or in the Church, you must be very cautious. Whether Republican or Democratic, American or Iraqi, Baptist or Pentecostal or any other denomination, I’m afraid you will always have to make an ungodly sacrifice when it comes to the traditions of men. That is why I warn you.

Now, if the Lord allows you to vote, by all means vote, just heed the warnings the Lord has laid forth. If the Lord tells you to always remain a Presbyterian, by all means, stay at that Church, but remember - your service is to Christ and all those who call on His name. If you are raised in a “Christian” nation, don’t call

those who are in an “Islamic” nation “devils”, because you both are deceived. No nation is Christian. How can it be? The Lord said the Kingdom of God dwells within you and we are in the time when no man will worship God in a set place, for true worshippers worship in Spirit and Truth. So how can a nation be “Islamic”? It is impossible for a government to enforce spiritual beliefs upon a people. The cry of the hearts of the people is great. Pray the Lord give you ears to hear. The reason why we are so quick to judge in this nation is because we are so afraid to die. Thus, the natural law of the flesh takes over - kill or be killed - but Christ says, “He who loves his life will lose it, and he who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life.”<sup>6</sup> Even our brother Paul believed and wrote, “For to me, to live is Christ, and to die is gain.”<sup>7</sup> Take heed brothers

Chapter Five

THE TWO KINDS OF  
PROPHET

You may be thinking that the two types of prophet are the Loud & the Quiet, or the Bold & the Meek, or the Rebellious & the Submissive. You may even think the only two kinds of prophet are male & female; however, I would like to venture even further and state the only two kinds of prophet are the Married and the Unmarried. I believe with all my heart that all prophets fall into one of these two categories. Praise the Lord!

## The Married Prophet

Before I continue, I need to mention that anyone who desires a godly life will suffer persecution. Your walk with Christ makes you a marked man. If you truly hold dear to His teachings, the glory of the Lord and His sufferings will rest upon you. With this in mind, my main concern for the married prophet is bitterness and hardness of heart. Of course it can happen to the unmarried prophet as well, but there is a greater cost to our sin – we make others pay an ungodly price.

*“With it (our tongue) we bless our God and Father, and with it we curse men, who have been made in the similitude of God. Out of the same mouth proceed blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not to be so.” James 3:9-10 (NKJV)*

Your husband, your wife, your children, everyone in your household is affected by the overflow of your heart. Trust me on this one. I have the power to bless or to curse, there is no in between. We like to think there is an “in between”, just like the world likes to think such things; however, the truth remains – there is nothing lukewarm about our Savior, so there should be nothing lukewarm about us.

The Lord was gracious to save me from “church-bashing”, and it is my prayer He will open your eyes to this deadly poison also. I am sorry the pastor of a church won’t listen to you and it breaks my heart that the brothers and sisters you have spoken to about sin will not repent, but these are the same which you may be dwelling with in Heaven. It is not so much if their salvation is assured, rather have you worked out yours with fear and trembling? By this I mean, be ever so cautious that you do not condemn, because if you condemn

you will be condemned. There is no way around this teaching.

Early in my walk with the Lord, a dear brother came up to me and shared how he heard I wanted to be a missionary<sup>8</sup>. I said “yes” at that time, not

Perhaps many of you have been dubbed a missionary. This is a great service to the kingdom of God; however, ironically enough, the word “missionary” is not in the scriptures. You may find it in the sub-headings: “Paul’s 1<sup>st</sup> Missionary Journey” or something like that. I would like to encourage you to focus more on the scriptures. Jesus taught, “The wisdom of God also said, ‘I will send them prophets and apostles...’” (Luke 11:49 NKJV). Paul writes, “And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry...” (Ephesians 4:11-12 NKJV). If the “wisdom of God” says these things, rest assured your calling falls in one of these categories also. The reason why I say this is for this reason; the callings of God come with power while the

(I'm sure now he meant "luggage" rather than "responsibility".) I thanked him and then quietly, yet fervently, kept on rebuking his words in my heart. It saddens me to say this, but this man has since been separated from his wife due to the years and years of his constant unhappiness. Can you imagine where his unhappiness came from? He had four children himself. Thus the Lord's words were proven true, when we condemn we are

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inventions of man do not. You have heard the stories of missionaries overseas and how miracles occur. This is because the devils don't see a "missionary", they see an apostle! They do not know what a "missionary" is, but they know an evangelist when they see one. My point is this, it seems the Church invented this term to once again "categorize" people. I beg you, break free from this bondage and accept with all meekness the callings of Jesus Christ.

condemned. This man laid an ungodly judgment on me and my family, and then he himself fell to the same judgment. What bothers me even more is the damage he has done to his wife and children.

Where on earth did this line of thinking come from? It surely didn't come from Heaven. I believe it came from his dissatisfaction with the Church. I tell you the truth, this man had, and still has, a great calling on his life. In his heart is a vast amount of the love of Christ! In his eyes is the fire of God! Yet his heart has become corrupt. I remember seeing his wife in a Church service one Sunday. Though others would say she is finally free, her eyes were full of sadness, because her hope was lost. There is no greater sadness when hope disappears. Who can possibly save you when your hope is gone? There is only one: Jesus Christ! Hallelujah! He is the One who does the impossible! Praise God!

This is my great concern for the Married Prophet. Satan is relentless when he attacks. He does not care for you one bit. If you only knew of the men I know, how the Church has rejected them and their words, and over time how their bitterness grows. They were not immune, I am not immune, and you are not immune to this type of attack. We do, however, have the Great Physician who can heal us and restore us, yet it is so much easier to remove the splinter before it becomes infected.

Please be very mindful that those of your own household see you bless God at the Church service and curse your brethren at home. At a young age, their great love for you overrides this flaw, but as they get older they will begin to see this hypocrisy and do one of three things. The first, they may join you in this madness and become twice the child of satan you are. Secondly, they will see you as a hypocrite and begin to hate you, thus turning their back on the Lord whose purpose it was to raise them in a

godly family. Finally and thankfully, they will see that you were not following Christ and decide for themselves that no matter what their parents have done, they will follow the Lord Jesus even unto death! This is the reason why we bicker and complain anyway, isn't it? We don't want to die. Our flesh wants to live and be satisfied, yet our spirit wants to serve the living Christ! Oh, take heed to these words my dear brothers and sisters who are married! Renew your mind and let the Lord replenish all those years the locusts have eaten away!

### The Unmarried Prophet

My dear brother or sister, let me share how my heart breaks at the rejection you have received. You have remained faithful to the Lord all these years. Some have been virgins since birth and others since rebirth. You fight the good fight to keep yourself pure and

your struggles at times seem to rattle the earth itself. Unfortunately, due to this walk with the Lord, you have suffered an unfair persecution. To be quite honest, the Church does not know how to handle you.

You are definitely a unique group of saints. While most of us are concerned about preaching on “wives submit to your husbands”, your focus is more on “Come quickly Lord Jesus!” The fervency you have for the Coming of the Lord blesses my heart to no end. This, however, can be intimidating to those of us who do not share the zeal you possess. Herein the snare for the unmarried prophet is laid, the option to be “normal”.

The good fight you must fight is not worrying about conforming to man’s standards for success in the Church. Regrettably, for one to move onward and upward in the Church, one must prove themselves to be responsible in running one’s family, loving towards one’s spouse, and diligent in Church

attendance. While all these are good qualifications for elders and deacons, and can be faked rather easily, I beg you to reconsider your calling. Your advancement will not be in the Church, but in the Kingdom of God. Your existence is not to please man, but Him who enrolled you into His army. When saints begin to quote Paul and Timothy to you, have overwhelming joy, for the ones they are referencing were unmarried also.

I know it seems so hard for you to establish your “legitimacy”, however, if your foundation be of Christ, you will be established by Him who called you. I pray you will continue to humble yourself. Then, with all meekness and boldness, cry out to your living God. He is so faithful. He will give you words to speak and in due time, He will bring those words to pass, because they are His, not yours. Thus, Christ Himself will prove He is with you, but this will not be for your glory, only His. Rest assured, even when your prophecies come to

pass, you will be rejected by men. Why? Because since the foundation of the world; those who are loved by God constantly reject the prophets who are sent by Him. Even you and I have had to wrestle with hard words from the Lord, but what makes the believer complete is His acceptance of the word spoken in love and the broken heart to receive the Lord's chastisement. We are all His children, and yet one day, we will be His Bride. Hallelujah!

Now, I am not forbidding marriage by any means. If the Lord blesses you with a wife or a husband, accept it with fear and trembling. Just remember the previous encouragement to the married prophet: Your spouse is not your trash bag. Don't just dump all your garbage on them. Make sure to deposit gold and silver in that heavenly account and you will have not only a husband or a wife, but an extension of you. Remember, the two shall become one! I pray that you will wisely enter into marriage, knowing the severity of the Lord. Don't play

games. Test all things! Love one another! Be forgetful! Very forgetful! Remember no wrongs! If you do this, you will have a lot less problems than I have had from learning the hard way.

Most of all, my dear brothers and sisters, don't forget you were called for a purpose. It's not because you are unwanted, or ugly, or "hated by God" that you are single. You are here on this earth to be a blessing. You will bring great joy to the married prophet who is struggling with his zeal for the Lord, and the married prophet can teach you great patience when things don't happen as fast as you want them to. We are all a part of the Body of Christ. We need one another. I pray we never forget that.

Chapter Six

A SUFFERING  
SERVANT

*“Therefore, since Christ suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves also with the same mind, for he who has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin, that he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh for the lusts of men, but for the will of God.” (1 Peter 4:1-2 NKJV)*

Our dear brother Paul writes:

*“I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy,*

*acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.” (Romans 12:1-2 NKJV)*

Our life-giving Savior says:

*“If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me. For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake will save it.” (Luke 9:23-24 NKJV)*

How powerful we would be if we truly embraced the sufferings of Christ and clothed ourselves with Him. Paul tells us to “be transformed by the renewing of your mind.” Brothers and sisters, the mind of Christ is not an elusive phenomenon. It is an achievable, tangible promise. It is our mind where

we belittle ourselves or we arrogantly puff ourselves up beyond measure, and yet Jesus wants us to have His mind. The power of what Peter says is remarkable!

*“Therefore, since Christ suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves also with the same mind...”*

Are you armed with mindset to suffer for those around you? Are you prepared to suffer in the flesh so Christ may be glorified in others? Remember what James told us? He said that our arguments come from the flesh and the war that rages in us. But if we would practice self-control and remember to “live is Christ”, then we would put this war that rages into submission before Christ. Oh yes, young prophets, it is a high cost, but if you can suffer this way for Christ, then He will be even more willing to place more and more responsibility on you. Of course, this will

mean more and more crushing, but your joy will be unspeakable! Hallelujah!

The sad part of embracing this way of thinking, and living, is that those who supposedly preach Christ will label you as having a "Martyr Spirit". I tell you truth, if we would truly share in the Spirit of those who were martyred before us, the Holy Ghost would not stop confirming the words of our Lord with signs and wonders. If someone says you have a "Martyr Spirit", go into your closet of prayer and shout "Hallelujah"! Rejoice as though the end of time was upon you and then weep for those who do not share in your joy. I tell you the truth, when the end finally comes, those whom you have shared the gospel with will be ready while those who still believe it is far off will stand in disbelief. I do not mean to insult those who preach Christ as though He is not coming quickly, but rather encourage you to search and read what is written. Now, as for you who only preach hoping to incur persecution, I pray that your desire to

preach the gospel of Christ would be motivated by love and tears, not anger. I hope your desire to shepherd is from the concern for others in your heart and not from the arrogance that you know how to do it better than your brother. I hope that we all would share in the Spirit of Christ - the Spirit of Truth.

*“Blessed is he who reads and those who hear the words of this prophecy, and keep those things which are written in it; for the time is near.”  
(Revelation 1:3 NKJV)*

Imagine living life through the fearful words which the apostle John both saw and heard. More than that, instead of imagining, believing and living what he wrote! He said “Blessed is he who reads and those who hear the words of this prophecy, and keep those things which are written in it...”

Blessed? Don't we mean "foolish"? No! He said "Blessed"! Why would we be blessed? We are blessed because, "...the time is near". Now, please understand I am not here preaching the end is at hand or am I saying that on July 12<sup>th</sup>, 1969 the world is coming to an end. That would make me, or anyone else, a false prophet. Our Lord and Savior warned us of such men who preach such things, but I am pleading with all the saints to live in such a way that no man knows the day or hour. You see, our Lord is like a thief in the night. Many of you preach as though He was not coming back quickly. You preach as though the end times were not upon us. You preach as though our Lord is blessing this country more than others. If that were the case, then Rome itself should be considered the epitome of God's blessing. Unfortunately, many of you believe it is; however, as the devil tempted Jesus in the wilderness and He withstood him, so now the devil continually tempts the men of this world. These men, who

desire to have money and power, willingly receive their father and embrace his teachings. And because they are afraid to die, they ensnare themselves in traps laid out by the enemy of their souls.

It is the mind of Christ which keeps you from the whims of the devil. It is the understanding of a foundation which is laid which no other man should lay - Jesus Christ. Not another man's version of Christ where he may preach how the Lord would probably react, but the truth in Christ where His teachings, and His teachings alone, guide us, give us insight, and show us just how reacted. Remember again Isaiah 53:

### **ISAIAH 53**

(King James Version)

*Who hath believed our report? and to whom  
is the arm of the LORD revealed?*

*For he shall grow up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground: he hath no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, [there is] no beauty that we should desire him.*

*He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were [our] faces from him; he was despised, and we esteemed him not.*

*Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted.*

*But he [was] wounded for our transgressions, [he was] bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace [was] upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.*

*All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all.*

*He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet*

*he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth.*

*He was taken from prison and from judgment: and who shall declare his generation? for he was cut off out of the land of the living: for the transgression of my people was he stricken.*

*And he made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death; because he had done no violence, neither [was any] deceit in his mouth.*

*Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise him; he hath put [him] to grief: when thou shalt make his soul an offering for sin, he shall see [his] seed, he shall prolong [his] days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in his hand.*

*He shall see of the travail of his soul, [and] shall be satisfied: by his knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many; for he shall*

*bear their iniquities.*

*Therefore will I divide him [a portion] with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he hath poured out his soul unto death: and he was numbered with the transgressors; and he bare the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.*

Dare I add to the glorious words spoken by the prophet Isaiah? And yet how does the whole passage start? It starts with a question: "Who has believed our report?" A suffering servant? No way! Didn't Peter tell us to arm ourselves with this mind of Christ? Ironically, what is the next question? "And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?" It has been revealed to babes, to infants, to the foolish, to the weak, and to the poor. That is what we were when we found Him. This is what we must remain to keep Him. It is when we become wise in our own eyes that we

cannot fathom this King who left everything and came to serve and save. It is when we become selfish that we are unable to love and suffer. It is when we become angry that we are unable to forgive and forget. And yet, look at all Jesus did! Read the passage again! This is the Christ! The Promised One! This is our King! This is our Savior! This is our Lord! He was, and He is, and He will be! Hallelujah!

Brothers and sisters, there is only one question that remains in this passage: *“And who will declare his generation?”* Will you? Will I even do it? Am I ashamed of Him who promised such a reward to those who are faithful? Are you ashamed? Perhaps we are afraid, but if we do not do it, who will? Who will declare His generation? The declaration will come from the ones who count their lives as nothing and decide, with their whole heart, to take up their cross and suffer for Christ.

My dear brothers and sisters, we cannot hide behind our doctrines

anymore. We cannot hide behind our “predestination”, our “sinner’s prayer”, our “freewill”, our “speaking in tongues”, our “holy dressing”, our “dancing before the Lord”, our “contemporary worship”, or our “hymns”. Why do we long to be enslaved by evil men who come in their own name and are not willing just to suffer for Him whose Name has the power to continually save us? We can no longer think that our denomination is the prophesied Remnant. It is true the Remnant exists among the denominations. Those whose hearts are pure, motives are just, and words are righteous, but no one denomination can be the Remnant. How audacious we would be to even think that thought! It is our journey with Christ which embarks us on a path of righteousness. It is being a living sacrifice and dying daily which produces holiness. The refining fire of sufferings cannot be fully explained in mere words; however, our brother Peter tells us through the Spirit of Christ:

*“Beloved, do not think it strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened to you; but rejoice to the extent that you partake of Christ’s sufferings, that when His glory is revealed, you may also be glad with exceeding joy. If you are reproached for the name of Christ, blessed are you<sup>9</sup>, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests upon you. On their part He is blasphemed, but on your part He is glorified. But let none of you suffer as a murderer, a thief, an evildoer, or as a busybody in other people’s matters. Yet if anyone suffers as a Christian, let him not be*

*ashamed, but let him glorify God in this matter. For the time has come for judgment to begin at the house of God; and if it begins with us first, what will be the end of those who do not obey the gospel of God?" (1 Peter 4:12-17 NKJV)*

same as the Lord's. Let us pray that He send His laborers out into the harvest, and remember He did not pray for more laborers, only that those who were already called be ready for service. Let us stop asking for more help and start working with everything He's already given us. You are not under equipped.

Brothers and sisters - be strong! Wrong no one. Keep the faith. Perhaps one day we will meet, pray together, and weep together. If not, then we will rejoice in Heaven together after He wipes away all of our tears. It is an honor to be in the company of men and women like you. Let us not love our lives unto death and may the testimony of Jesus Christ abound in us all. May our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of the Living God, bless you, heal you, and keep you until His coming. Amen.
