Mission - The Diana Price Fish Cancer Foundation was established in 1989 with the mission of helping adult cancer patients enjoy life. We are now in our 17th year of providing social, cultural, and recreational opportunities for adults with cancer and their families. By giving our participants something to look forward to every month, as well as an opportunity to spend precious time with loved ones, we are able to help them "take a break" from their cancer. We have grown from an organization that served 14 patients in our first year to arranging over 5,500 activities for nearly 2,000 cancer patients in 2005, and we remain the only organization of our kind in the United States.

Programs - Anyone who is 18 years of age or older, lives or receives treatment in Colorado, AND is actively dealing with cancer is eligible to use the Foundation's services. Diana Price-Fish Cancer Foundation runs two programs to meet its mission of helping adult cancer patients enjoy life.

Both of our programs are designed so that the participant can take part in one activity per month for as long as they have cancer. When a participant is declared healthy or in remission, they "graduate" from the program.

The Passport to Enjoyment Program allows cancer patients to identify the activity they want to enjoy and leaves making the needed arrangements to the Foundation's staff. Direct Play also lets participants enjoy "spur of the moment" activities through a reimbursement program.

The Rosebud Program pairs adult cancer patients (participants) with volunteers who assist them in identifying enjoyable activities to meet that participant's particular needs. The volunteer works with the Foundation to make the necessary arrangements for the activity. The volunteer's role may also include providing transportation to and from the activity and accompanying the participant during the activity. Rosebud volunteers also provide a welcomed "time out" for the participant and the participant's support network.

Mission - Fairygodmother Foundation grants wishes without bias towards gender, race, religion, socioeconomic status, veteran status, marital status, sexual orientation, disability, or nature of illness. In addition, the following restrictions, limitations, and guidelines apply.

Wish recipients must be an adult with a terminal illness. We define "adult" as 18 years of age or older. We define "terminal" as having less than one year to live. A medical form verifying the health status of the wish recipient must be completed by the treating physician.

The wish must be from the wish recipient. The wish recipient must be able to communicate the wish and must be able to comprehend the wish experience. It must be the wish of the recipient.

The wish must not be a surprise. As appealing as it may be to surprise the wish recipient with something they have always wanted, Fairygodmother Foundation does not participate in surprises. We do not want to risk violating the privacy of the wish recipient.

The wish must be the wish recipient's one and only wish. The wish recipient must not have had a wish granted by any other wish-granting organization previously, and must not be currently working with another wish-granting organization.

All participants of the wish must be immediate family members to the wish recipient. Fairygodmother Foundation defines "immediate family" as spouse or significant other, children under the age of 18 living in the same household; or mother, father, and siblings (brothers and sisters) under the age of 18 living in the same household.

Travel wishes must take place within the continental United States. Fairygodmother Foundation cannot grant wishes for foreign travel, or for travel to Alaska, Hawaii, or Puerto Rico.

These are the dreams that may require the community to really get involved in fundraising and planning. Examples of this type of dream are overnight trips or finding a lost loved one.

LRF offers a limited financial assistance program to help improve patients' quality of life and assist them in receiving the lifesaving treatments that they need.

Applicants must:

1. Complete an application and demonstrate a financial need.
2. Be applying to this program for the first time.
3. Currently be undergoing lymphoma treatment as certified by their physician.
4. Have the ability to save receipts for covered expenses and send them in for reimbursement in a timely manner.

Patients can be reimbursed through LRF's program, up to \$250, for "quality of life" expenses, including travel and transportation (usually gas receipts), temporary lodging, childcare, homecare, cosmetic aides (wigs, hats), medical devices, and hygiene products (bandages, lotions). It is highly recommended that patients begin saving receipts for covered expenses as soon as possible.

In addition, uninsured or underinsured applicants should indicate on their application and discuss with the Coordinator if they have accumulated medical debt. Funds are available to reimburse healthcare providers for patients' hospital or physician bills that insurance will not reimburse.

LRF's program does not cover everyday living expenses, such as food, rent, or utility bills.

All applications are reviewed and ranked by a committee of volunteers, comprised of lymphoma survivors and healthcare professionals. Thanks to the dream of one eye surgeon in Fresno, California, one day a year on Mission Cataract Day, hundreds of people throughout the United States are given the gift of sight at no cost to them or to Medicare, Medicaid or private insurance.

The dream started in 1991 when Frederick A. Richburg, MD, Medical Director of Valley Eye Institute in Fresno, California decided to donate one day for free cataract surgery and create a local mission right in his own back yard. Consequently Mission Cataract Fresno '91 was born. That year he and local volunteers screened over 150 people, and he performed free cataract surgery for 21.
