

Peyton Book Corrections – 4 March 2009

This document of corrections is for owners of the Peyton genealogy book that I published in early 2004: "PEYTONs Along the Aquia" by Edna Barney, (CS71.P5195 2004b). The following four pages should be printed and placed in the front of the book.

A new edition of this work is now available, "[PEYTONs Along the Aquia – Second Edition](#)," published May 2009. It contains all of the corrections and additions cited here, plus much additional information on this PEYTON lineage that I have uncovered since 2004. ~~Edna Barney

Page 9 – Should read *"Henry PEYTON, the immigrant, son of Henry PEYTON of Lincoln's Inn, died about May of 1659."*

Page 19 - Gerrard PEYTON

On page 19 of "PEYTONs Along the Aquia", Gerrard PEYTON never married. The Miss HARDWICH mentioned in his will was his half sister.

Page 21 - TYPO

On page 21 of "PEYTONs Along the Aquia", in the paragraph that begins *"Ellen may have been ..,"* the phrase *"her uncle"* should be written as *"his uncle."* ~~Edna Barney

Page 40 - Sarah Hale

I am tending to believe that the Sarah HALE on page 40 of "PEYTONs Along the Aquia" was married to a different Valentine PEYTON. Because her father and husband had connections to land in Fauquier County, I now believe her husband was probably the Valentine PEYTON (#107) of Loudoun County on page 71. That will eliminate the death date for Sarah HALE, as it was tied to the will of Valentine PEYTON (#50). The name of the wife of Valentine PEYTON on page 40, is unknown, however she may be related to those mentioned by him on that page.

Page 51, John WHEELER

I no longer attribute John WHEELER as a second husband of Diana. He seems married to a different "Diana."

Page 79 Yelverton Peyton

Regarding #54 Yelverton PEYTON (1735-ante1783) on page 79 of "PEYTONs Along the Aquia": Although Yelverton PEYTON is a proven DAR Patriot (#A090000) of the American Revolution, for his service as a member of the Committee of Safety for Stafford County, Virginia, there is no evidence that he was ever a soldier in that war. It was another Yelverton PEYTON who was a soldier in Virginia's Continental Line (see page 138).

Through additional analysis of the quite substantial Revolutionary War public service claims presented by Yelverton PEYTON of Peyton's Ordinary, I have determined that he died between 1781 and 1783.

Page 92 — George PEYTON

George PEYTON is possibly the father of James PEYTON, born circa 1785 of Culpeper County, Virginia, whose mother was Lucy. If that is the case, George PEYTON would have been dead before 1801. Other than that, I have no documentation for a wife nor any children for this person.

Page 99 — Thomas & Ephraim PEYTON

On page 99 of "PEYTONs Along the Aquia" Melinda PEYTON did not marry Ephraim or Thomas PEYTON, sons of Henry PEYTON, therefore Sally PEYTON is a daughter of neither of them. ~Edna Barney

Page 102 — Wife of Evan PEYTON

Continuing my travails with the PEYTONs of Falmouth, on page 102 of "PEYTONs Along the Aquia," I had accepted research from family members of Evan PEYTON that his wife was Anne CARTER. However, my own recent research has failed to find any documentation of this. For now, as far as I am concerned, the wife of Evan PEYTON is unknown. Whoever she was, the wife of Evan PEYTON was probably born about 1742, not 1738.

Page 103 — Charles PEYTON

His birth date is 8 June 1761 (not 1751).

Page 110 -- I have determined that the John PEYTON who married Polly Butler, is much more likely to be the son of Jeremiah PEYTON, the brother of Nancy PEYTON, on page 127. John seems to be his oldest son. Nancy's son, John PEYTON, would have been another John PEYTON, and one of her youngest sons.

Page 114 — Sarah P. HARRISON

I now believe that the "Sarah P. HARRISON," on page 114 of "PEYTONs Along the Aquia", is a fictional personage. There is NO documentation that Sarah P. HARRISON of Prince William County, wife of Valentine PEYTON, ever existed. Court records exist that document the wife of Valentine PEYTON as Sarah WEST, daughter of Hugh WEST.

Pages 116, 117 — Nancy PEYTON and Valentine HARRISON

In "PEYTONs Along the Aquia", Ann PEYTON, daughter of Craven, did not marry Valentine HARRISON. The Nancy PEYTON who married Captain Valentine HARRISON is on page 66. The marriage of Valentine HARRISON and Nancy PEYTON is documented in "DAR Patriot Index" - Centennial Edition. In addition, the 1785 Deed, Prince William

County, Virginia, documents their marriage to have taken place between 1774 and 1785. They were first cousins.

Page 117 — Francis PEYTON (1764-1836)

Regarding the family of Lieutenant Francis PEYTON on page 117, of "PEYTONs Along the Aquia", it seems the source that I used (#434-#441, page 216) contained a number of inaccuracies. I will update those that I have found so far. There is a Bible record that documents that on 20 October 1789, Francis PEYTON married Sarah FOUSHEE: "*Francis PEYTON and Sarah FOUSHEE were married at Alexandria the 20th October 1789.*" Sarah (Foushee) PEYTON left a will in Alexandria County, Virginia dated 12 November 1848 (Will Book 5). Francis PEYTON died at Alexandria County. I find no documentation that Francis PEYTON married before 1786, to Sarah WEST (1769-1849), as given by source #435, nor do I know who this Sarah WEST was.

Their child #207 on page 216, is recorded in the PEYTON bible as "Thomas Jefferson."

Page 126 – Lettice, wife of Charles S. PEYTON, I see no documentation for her maiden name of "LONG."

Pages 142, 143 — Charles Peyton of Falmouth

As cited above (page 41), he was born 8 June 1761 (not 1751) in Virginia. I am making more corrections to the family of #170 Charles PEYTON, on pages 142, 143 of "PEYTONs Along the Aquia," I find no documentation for the use of the name "Carter," nor any connection with the Carter family for these PEYTONs. The wife of Charles PEYTON is documented as "Elizabeth (maiden name unknown)," which comes from source #555, along with her birth and death dates. Their marriage date should be changed to "about 1786," documented by source #564 and the 1850 Census.

Page 143 — Ann PEYTON

I made a diversion into the parents of PEYTON cousin John T. ROBERTSON, and I got them wrong. Person #171, Ann PEYTON, does not exist and I know nothing about the parents of person #264, John T. ROBERTSON. I can only verify that he was a cousin of the children of person #170, Charles PEYTON.

Page 144 — Peytons of Falmouth, Virginia

In "PEYTONs Along the Aquia," I have recently discovered an error in the Revolutionary War Pension file of Charles PEYTON. Therefore, the "heirs at law of Jas. Peyton" (children on page 144) were actually "*the heirs at law*" (children) of his brother, #170 Charles PEYTON, on page 142. James PEYTON, according to the 1820 Census of Stafford County, Virginia at Falmouth, seems to have children, however, at present, I am not certain of their names.

Page 165 Margaret Moore

TYPO: In "PEYTONs Along the Aquia," Margaret MOORE, the wife of Craven PEYTON, died on 23 April 1873 (not 1973).

Page 168 Nancy Peyton Limbrick

In "PEYTONs Along the Aquia," I have recently determined that #267 Nancy PEYTON is the daughter of Charles PEYTON, not of James PEYTON. She is a niece of James PEYTON. I had interpreted her ancestry using an affidavit in the Revolutionary War Pension of Charles PEYTON. Today, I made a new search of the pensions at the National Archives and I found a letter that I had missed where Nancy P. LIMBRICK described herself as the daughter of Charles PEYTON.

Page 204, Source 30b

The source "30b" is a misprint. It should read: "*Parish Record, Church of England, Saint Dunstan, Stepney, London, England (Extracted by Family History Center, Salt Lake City, Utah).*"
