

Alison Shawl[®]

Materials:

Worsted Weight Yarn

Needles size 7 and size 10

I used 8 skeins of Louisa Harding KashmereAran (This can be done in fingering or lace weight using size 5 and 6 needles and increasing the yoke section another 6 rows—alternating a Knit row with a K1 P1 row to keep Fleck pattern)

Using yarn doubled for first row, cast on 10 stitches one inch apart on size 7 needles

Yoke

- Row 1 K1, YO—19 st
 Row 2 (all even rows) K1, purl to last stitch, K1
 Row 3 K1, YO—37 stitches
 Row 5 K1, P1 across ending K
 Row 7 K1 *YO, K1 across ending K1 —73 stitches
 Row 9 K 1, P1 across ending K
 Row 11 Knit
 Row 13 K1, P1 across ending K
 Row 15 Knit
 Row 17 K1, * YO, K1 across ending K —145 stitches
 Row 19 Knit
 Row 21 K1, P1 end K2
 Row 23 Knit
 Row 25 K1, P 1 end K2
 Row 27 Knit
 Row 29 K1, P 1 end K2
 Row 31 Knit
 Row 33 K1, P1 end K2
 Row 35 Knit
 Row 37 K1, P1 end K2
 Row 39 Knit
 Row 41 K1, *YO, K1 across ending K1 —289 stitches
 Row 42 Knit



Row 43 Knit decreasing 8 stitches across row (about every 32 stitches; just k2 together)—you want the row to have 281 stitches

Row 44 Knit

Body

Switch to size 10 needles

- Row 1 K4, place marker *YO, K2, K3T(ogether), K2, YO, K1. Repeat across end with YO, place marker, K4
 Row 2 K4 Purl 273 K4

Repeat these 2 rows for entire length of shawl (you decide how long you would like it to be). Knit 4 rows and do Picot bind off on row 5.

In first stitch *Knit Cast On 2 more stitches, Bind off 4— repeat across row until all stitches are bound off.
